

JOB PURPOSE

- 1. This post provides a high level technical production service to the Beacon's programme within and outwith the venue providing a first class service to artists, promoters and other clients
- **2.** The post is responsible for the day to day delivery of a comprehensive technical service and deploys technical resource to meet the needs of the varied arts and events programmes within budget
- **3.** The post contributes to the development of the technical service to the highest standard, reporting on performance and developing new initiatives and best practice that will contribute to the growth of Beacon Arts Centre
- **4.** The post is required to have specialism in one of theatre lighting, sound or stage management.

KEY TASKS

TECHNICAL DUTIES

- To maintain and operate staging, lighting, sound, AV and effects equipment to deliver Beacon's arts and events programme and other services
- Liaise with in-house and visiting / touring companies, promoters and artists to provide the highest standard of service and to ensure specific production and technical requirements are met as far in advance as possible
- Provide technical support, health and safety advice for Beacon's touring and off-site programmes
- Operate room booking software to ensure forward planning, communication of information and contractual obligations for all activity

CO-WORKING

- Supervise and direct freelance / casual crew for effective delivery of the programme
- Support the Operations Team to ensure all spaces are clean, tidy, safe and well maintained

- Support the planning of rotas with the Technical Manager
- Support partner organisations including West College Scotland to deliver placement and work experience programmes

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

- · Manage set budgets
- Check and sign off freelance / casual crew time sheets for processing by payroll

FACILITIES MANAGEMENT

- Be a keyholder and fulfill keyholding duties including opening and closing the venue in line with Company policy and procedures
- Maintain the Company's equipment inventory in a serviceable and safe condition in line with Health and Safety legislation
- · Deliver the Company's equipment hire business

HEALTH AND SAFETY DUTIES

- Deliver safe and efficient working practices in line with Health and Safety legislation
- Carry out risk assessments on all activity for both front of house and technical areas alongside specific assessments for off-site activity supporting the wider team
- Deliver, where relevant, job training for the wider team in risk management and other aspects of Health and Safety at Work including for example, manual handling


