- Dance events will take place in the community starting at the end of November and leading up to a final Social Dance at Beacon Art Centre on the 14th of December with a live band.
- These sessions will be offered at different locations throughout Inverclyde.
- Ideally, but not necessarily, the dance artists will have one years' experience delivering workshops to ages 55+.
- Qualifications are desired but not necessary, previous experience will be taken into consideration.
- All candidates must be an existing member or eligible to become a member of the Protection of Vulnerable Groups Scheme.
