

## **ABOUT CREATABILITY**



Additional funding from Creative Scotland's Youth Arts Access Fund has allowed the Beacon to expand the capacity of the Creatability project which has previously been focused on delivering aerial dance opportunities for disabled young people.

Our new **Creatability** programme will expand on the successful template to offer a multi-art form creative programme to neurodiverse children and young people with additional support needs and disabled young people aged 4-21 years. It will cover four main creative art forms:

 Creatability: Youth Theatre Creatability: Music Makers Creatability: Visual Artists Creatability: Aerial Dance

The work will be largely young person led with participants being given the opportunity to inform what is explored through each art form

The programme is designed for in-person delivery, however contingency plans for online and home delivery will be designed with young people, project partners, and project staff in response to Covid-19 restrictions.

Participants will be part of the Creatability **Collective** creating an ensemble atmosphere encouraging social responsibility and peer support. The project will offer a positive, safe, and nurturing creative space for young people to independently form friendships and develop their creative skills as part of the Creatability Collective. Through creative arts we will provide a space for young people to find and actively use their voice artistically and creatively. Young people will be supported, encouraging them to be socially, culturally, environmentally, and politically engaged through the arts.

As part of the project, participants will have the opportunity to be a young ambassador, ensuring that young people's voices are not only heard but celebrated in the design and future development of the project.

Creatability is funded by the Scottish Government's Youth Arts Fund through Creative Scotland with support from Youth Music Initiative and Time to Shine. The Youth Arts Fund ensures creative opportunities for children and young people continue to exist across Scotland despite the COVID-19 pandemic.

## **JOB PROFILE**

The **Creatability Project Co-ordinator** will ensure smooth delivery of a high-quality experience for disabled young people working with freelance artists and multiple partners; close co-ordination, planning, management, and monitoring is critical to the success of this project.

To do this, the postholder will work closely with the Beacon's Creative Learning Co-ordinator to plan, deliver and evaluate the programme. The role includes administration and session co-ordination to ensure all participants have a positive experience.

We are looking for a highly motivated person who has the skills and personal commitment to help us support disabled young people in our community. We need someone who has an eye for both the details of project management and the bigger picture of removing barriers to the arts.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Ensure the effective and valuable delivery of the programme with positive feedback from participants, creative professionals, and other stakeholders.
- Close co-ordination between all the partner organisations with positive feedback.
- Collate and monitor individual participant access requirements to remove barriers to their participation, ensuring required resources are in place in a timely manner.
- Successful coordination of the administrative and logistical requirements of the programme including scheduling, communications and monitoring the budget.
- Successful coordination of in-person participant experience of the programme including supporting freelance practitioners and other stakeholders when activities are taking place in the building.
- Collaborate with the Marketing Officer and Customer Service Supervisor to ensure the project is integral to the life and success of the Beacon.
- Work with the Creative Learning Co-ordinator to ensure that all project staff and trainees are supported to deliver the project to a high standard.
- Ensure Creatability activity is compliant with the Beacon's policies and protocols, safeguarding, health and safety and other legal requirements.

## REQUIREMENTS FOR THE JOB




